Supple Launches Supple Squad Gives Back Program with First Charitable Partner: Concerns of Police Survivors (C.O.P.S.)


New partnership kicks off with support to help C.O.P.S. rebuild the lives of survivors impacted by line-of-duty deaths.


organization rebuilding the shattered lives of surviving family members and co-workers affected by a line-of-duty death.
